Defendant Officer Caesar Goodson, by undersigned counsel, hereby files this Motion to Unseal Bench Conference and for reasons states:


1. During the trial of *State v. William Porter*, Defendant Porter indicated an intent to call Lt. Robert Quick as a witness.


