Upon request, the Court will accommodate jurors who need breaks, are unable to sit or stand for lengthy periods, and jurors who may need a 12-month temporary or permanent excusal. Jurors with difficulty walking may request to be sent to a courtroom closer to the Jury Assembly Room. Also, hearing or speech impaired jurors may request sign language interpreters or assisted hearing devices. Where possible, other accommodations may be made by the Court upon a juror's request.

Jurors who need to eat or take medication at certain intervals should bring those items with them. A physician's letter should be brought for jurors with pacemakers or other sensitive devices. Meals or medications requiring refrigeration are to be carried in insulated bags (or some other appropriate means) since refrigeration is not available in the courthouses. For jurors who require use of a lactation room, one is available for use at any time throughout the entirety of your jury service; a refrigerator is available in the lactation room for storage purposes.

A copy of the necessary form is attached. It is to be completed by a physician when a juror is requesting to be excused from jury duty because of a physical or mental disability.

In a separate mailing, you will receive a yellow computerized notice concerning your request. However, the attached form is to be received in the Jury Commissioner's Office no later than the date stated in this letter.

COPIES are not accepted. FAXES will ONLY be accepted if received from the signing physician's office. There will be no exceptions.
