

**IN THE

Administrative Order No. 2024-12

WHEREAS, effective October 1, 2024, amendments to Md. Code Ann., Bus. Occ. & Prof. § 20-401 require the private home detention monitoring agency responsible for monitoring a defendant to notify both the Court and a designated law enforcement agency if the defendant has violated a condition of home detention monitoring; and

WHEREAS Md. Code Ann., Bus. Occ. & Prof. §§ 20-401(b)(1)-(3) requires the Court to designate a law enforcement agency to receive said notifications; it is

THEREFORE, on this 18th day of October 2024, hereby

ORDERED that, by agreement of the Court and the Baltimore Police Department, for cases within the jurisdiction of the Circuit Court for Baltimore City, the designated law enforcement agency to be notified under the above-referenced statutory provisions shall be the Baltimore Police Department; and it is further

ORDERED that this designation shall only apply for the limited purpose of notifications pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Bus. Occ. & Prof. §§ 20-401(b)(1)-(3).
